## Pupil Participation Learning Network

On Thursday 22nd June, Digital Leaders from Glasllwch Primary School took part in a Pupil Participation Learning Network at St. Julian's Primary School. We have been involved in this celebration event over a number of years, with many of our pupil groups attending to share their research projects and achievements.

## Colours of the World

During this half-term, we have enjoyed engaging in a whole school project 'Colours of the World'. The children have had a fantastic time taking part in a wide variety of activities, whilst developing as ethical, informed citizens who are ready to be citizens of Wales and the world.

### Growth Mind-set & Digital Competency Framework (DCF) Sharing Event

On Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> June, we were pleased to be able to host our green school triad sharing event. All staff from Langstone Primary School, Newport, and Maendy Primary School, Cwmbran joined us for a twilight session. During the event, staff from all three schools shared Growth Mind-set and DCF projects they have undertaken during this academic year. As always this was a fantastic opportunity to share good practice and celebrate the positive impact on learning as a result of the projects. We will continue to work on collaborative projects within this triad of schools during 2017-18.

### Successful Futures

In February 2015, a review of the school curriculum and assessment arrangements, commissioned by the Welsh Government, resulted in Professor Donaldson making a number of recommendations that will shape educational reform in Wales. Key features of the new curriculum will include:

- Four key purposes: to develop pupils as;
  - o Ambitious capable learners
  - o Enterprising, creative contributors
  - o Ethical, informed citizens
  - o Healthy, confident individuals
- Six areas of learning and experience
  - o Language, literacy and communication
  - o Mathematics and numeracy
  - o Science and technology
  - o Humanities
  - o Expressive arts
  - o Health and wellbeing
- Literacy, numeracy and digital competence as cross-curricular themes
- No more key stages, but five, three-year progression steps

Whilst schools are not required to use the new curriculum until September 2021, elements of the new curriculum could be available by September 2018. As a school we have been engaged with the recommendations set out in Successful Futures over the past two years and as a result we are continually evaluating our practice and making changes to ensure that our curriculum reflects Donaldson's recommendations.

### Attendance
