Dear Parents / Carer / Guardian,

We were notified, late yesterday evening, of two confirmed cases of COVID-19, in morning Nursery and Year 1. In both cases, thankfully, the children are doing well.

In line with guidance from Welsh Government, Environmental Health and Newport City Council, all children in both classes have been instructed to self - isolate for 14 days and will be allowed to return to school on Monday 19th October.

Due to Nursery staff having to isolate, afternoon Nursery are unable to return until 19th October but do not have to isolate, this clarification has been given to us this morning by Environmental Health.

Siblings of the children in both classes should still come to school unless they are siblings of the positive cases.

Environmental Health will be following up on any contacts in relation to children in both classes as well as associated staff contacts.

During their period of self - isolation children and staff in both classes:

- **must** remain at home
- **must** minimise contact with other people in their home
- **must not** go to public areas, other people's houses or use public transport
- **must not let other people** visit them at home

You are aware of all the measures we have put in place to minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-19 in school. Please continue to support us in the following ways:

- Adhere to social distancing rules at all times - when entering/exiting school via our one-way system and when waiting on the yard
- Do not allow your child to mix with children outside of their class bubble whilst on school premises
- Leave the premises as soon as you have seen your child to their line or into school in the mornings
- When your child is handed over to you at the end of the school day, keep them with you and leave the premises straight away. No children are to leave parents and play on the field or the school yard.
- Remind children of the importance of washing hand regularly and hand sanitising.

I want to reassure you that we will continue to be vigilant and do all we can to provide the safest possible environment for our school community.
